

Directions to Alvecote Wood

From the M42

Turn off at **Junction 10** Tamworth and at the roundabout follow the signs for Tamworth.

Don't take the first junction (signposted Stoneydelph) as although this is the most direct route, it also leads you past some speed cameras that are well hidden and it is hard to spot the change in speed limit along this road too.

Take the **second junction signposted Glascote/Wilnecote**

At the roundabout take the **third exit right**.

Then follow the common directions below

From the A5

Follow the A5 until you reach the junction signposted **Glascote/Wilnecote**. If you are heading westbound, this is two junctions after the junction with the M42.

If you are heading eastbound, this is one junction after the turn-off for Tamworth town centre (A51) and the Ventura Park shopping centre and Snowdome. (Basically go past the Snowdome and take the next junction.)

At the **roundabout take the first exit left**.

Then follow the common directions below.

Common directions

You will be on a road called **Marlborough Way**. Follow this road past a pedestrian light, and two sets of traffic lights until you come to a roundabout. At the roundabout turn **right third exit**. You will be on a dual carriageway, the B5000 or Glascote Road.

At the **next three roundabouts take the second exit straight on**. The road will then become a single carriageway again.

Carry on up the hill past the industrial estate on the left. You will eventually start passing fields on the left.

At the top of the hill you will see a **county sign for Warwickshire**.

Immediately after this sign is a **turning on the left (Robey's Lane)**. It will also have a signpost for Priory Park Go Kart Track. Take this turning.

Follow the road downhill under the trees and round a sharp left-hand bend.

After a short straight bit the road bends slightly left again, and there is a (slightly bent) chevron on the bend. This chevron marks the start of Alvecote Wood.

You will see the Wood on your right as the road straightens. About 150 yards on your right is the entrance.

You should be able to pull in there and park. Please come as far in as you can to allow others to park too – there is a bit of a driveway and a bit of concrete hard standing just outside the barn.
