The Woodland

Alvecote Wood, combined with the adjacent Betty's Wood, totals 20 acres. This comprises 11 acres of precious Ancient Woodland plus 9 acres of former arable land where we planted thousands of native broadleaf trees, sowed wildflower meadows and dug new ponds. The entire site is managed for wildlife and community benefit.

We have owned Alvecote Wood since 2007 and added the field that is now Betty's Wood in 2010. It is home to many species of birds, insects, wild flowers, fungi and other creatures, some of them locally or nationally important.

The site is designated as a Local Wildlife Site and a Site of Importance for Nature Conservation.

Our 12 ponds are home to a large variety of insects such as dragonflies and damsel flies, plus many amphibians and reptiles like toads, newts and occasional grass snakes. We also have some rare pond plants enhancing the wet habitats.

Many types of butterflies and bees can be found in our 4 wildflower meadows and amongst the trees.

The woodland is home for rare birds such as yellowhammers and willow tits. Other highlights are woodpeckers, owls, and buzzards.

Most of the mature trees on site are oak, around 100-200 years of age. We have planted more trees and encourage natural regeneration from our own seed.
